

Download Mac Manual Restore Iphone

Restore all content to iPhone from a backup

Turn on a new or newly erased iPhone. Follow the online instructions to choose a language and region. Tap Set Up Manually. Tap Restore from iCloud Backup, then follow the onscreen instructions. You're asked for your Apple ID. If you've forgotten your Apple ID, see the Recover your Apple ID website.

Restore your iPhone, iPad, or iPod to ...

A factory restore erases the information and settings on your iPhone, iPad, or iPod and installs the latest version of iOS, iPadOS, or iPod software. Get your device ready Make sure your Mac or PC is updated.

Restore your iPhone, iPad, or iPod touch ...

Restore your device from an iTunes backup. Open iTunes on the Mac or PC that you used to back up your device. Connect your device to your computer with a USB cable. If a message asks for your device passcode or to Trust This Computer, follow the onscreen steps. If you forgot your passcode, get help.

How to Force Restart or Hard Reset the iPhone 8 and iPhone ...

Keep in mind that Apple now refers to the Sleep/Wake button as the Side button as of the iPhone 8, iPhone 8 Plus, and iPhone X. Press and quickly release the Volume Up button. Press and quickly release the Volume Down button. Press and hold the Side button (aka power) until you see the Apple logo.
